## Section 4: First aid measures

### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

<b>General advice:</b>	In the case of accident or if you feel unwell, seek medical advice immediately with this document, refer to following.

### Section 5: Firefighting measures

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#### 5.1 Extinguishing media

#### Respiratory protection:
